



Susan Davis

Teacher, Mother, Role Model, Kindhearted Soul, Family Woman July 26, 1945 ~ October 20, 2024

Dear Citizens,

Just over a week ago we sent an announcement about the passing of Susan Davis. Since then I have taken the time to reflect about Susan and her family and what I would share.

Susan was one of the most compassionate people I have ever met. She always inquired about how you and your family were doing. She would update me on her three sons, and her eyes would immediately get a twinkle as she relayed something about each of them.

I remember when her boys were very young and she was continually taking note of their activities. She was thoughtful and respectful of them. If they needed to be steered in the proper direction she quietly nudged them and they changed course. If she had other styles of correction I was not privy to them, and I only make mention of it because her style of

guidance was so far superior to my own and others'.

I heard her praise and encourage them often. She was a cheerleader for her family.

I generally avoid putting religious observations in my remembrances because not only am I more spiritual than religious and but also our membership derives from many different faiths and backgrounds. In the instance of remembering Sue this would be a great omission, because Sue truly lived her faith and family as one. She wasn't at all preachy; she was simply a continual mentor of kindness and acceptance.

Susan's life was intrinsically linked to her spiritual commitments. I remember when her husband Russell converted to Catholicism and later became a deacon. At her graveside service he presided, and he joked that many folks thought he became Catholic because "Sue made me." He said he became Catholic because "I wanted what Susan had."

I believe it is possible for someone to glow in their faith, and if so, Sue was indeed radiant. She touched people with her smile and capacity to be an active listener. Even her laugh was kindhearted and warm.

At her church service Monsignor Louis Marucci gave her eulogy and spoke of her embrace of him as an extended family member when he joined the St. John Bosco parish as a young priest. A short time after being assigned to the parish he was stricken with multiple sclerosis. Everything was brand-new for him: the parish, the illness (at first yet to be diagnosed), and the congregants. I remember this time well. Susan clearly adopted him during this difficult period and he expressed his gratitude at her funeral service. He mentioned that her profession as a special education teacher could not have been in better keeping with her abilities and kindness. She always offered encouragement and compassion.

One of her sons spoke of her shopping and gift-giving abilities – always just what a person needed. All spoke of her kindness. Clearly her best gift to the community was the example she set for each of us. She showed us that it only takes a moment to be thoughtful, to be kind.

Once again our condolences go to her family: husband Russell, sons Dr. Russell O. Davis III (Marybeth), Dr. Brian Davis (Kelly), and Matthew Davis (Katherine), and her cherished grandchildren, Declan, Drew, Brooke, Delany, Ryan, Samuel, and Mateo and to all her family members and friends. She will be sorely missed by the community.

She also supported her husband in his ministry as a Deacon.

Upon becoming a grandmother to seven, she reignited her love for sports fandom by attending countless grandchildren's games and activities. Her unwavering devotion, generous heart, and unconditional love will be remembered forever.
